

# Digital Europe program

- DIGITAL EUROPE program is the first EU program specifically dedicated to supporting the roll out of digital technologies across the economy.
- Grants EUR 7.5 billion for projects in 5 key capacity areas:
  - Super computers (HPC)
  - Artificial Intelligence (AI)
  - Cybersecurity
  - Advanced digital skills
  - European Digital Innovation Hubs.



# European Digital Innovation Hubs (EDIHs)


- EDIHs play a central role in the Digital Europe Program to stimulate the broad uptake of Artificial Intelligence, High Performance Computing (HPC) and Cybersecurity.
- Hubs will help companies to become more competitive with regard to their business/production processes, products or services using digital technologies, by providing access to technical expertise and experimentation, so that companies can "test before invest".
- They also provide innovation services, such as financing advice, training and skills development that are needed for a successful digital transformation.
   Environmental issues will be taken into account, in particular with regard to energy consumption and low carbon emissions.

# European Digital Innovation Hubs' (EDIH) network

- The European Commission, in order to promote the digitisation of businesses and public sector in the EU, provides EUR 750 m to assist the setup of an EU-wide network of European Digital Innovation Hubs (EDIHs) via the Digital Europe program.
- Apart from DIGITAL funds, Member States will also contribute to this digital transformation (50% co-funding) with the possibility of contributions from the private sector.
- Some Member States also chose to fund extra-hubs (30-50) under the Recovery and Resilience Fund (RRF). 26% of this RRF is dedicated to digital reforms and investments. 20% of the fund goes to businesses.
- Lastly, Member States can also rely on synergy funding to support their hubs e.g. ERDF (European Regional Development Fund)





## Why a second EDIH call?

(1) DIGITAL budget still available

In some countries, the budget from Digital Europe programme was not fully spent (not enough proposal above threshold), so the country coverage was not complete. This call will allow those potential EDIHs who did not manage to succeed at the first instance to reapply a second time.

(2) NATIONAL budget still available

Other countries expressed the intention to <u>fund further hubs using</u>
<u>National budget</u>, on condition that they are evaluated above threshold (Seal of Excellence). <u>In this second call, a Seal of Excellence</u> will be awarded to the proposals that will be evaluated above threshold, even if no budget is available in Digital Europe Programme for the country.

# From the (2<sup>nd</sup>) call document

This second call complements Call 1 and is therefore only opened for:

- 1) Designated potential EDIH for participating countries which have not submitted proposals in the first call namely **Liechtenstein and Luxembourg**; (2 EDIH)
- 2) Designated potential EDIH for participating countries in which the coverage after the first call was not complete, namely:
  - a. Czechia: Liberec and Hradec Králové region
  - **b.Denmark**: Greater Copenhagen; Southern Denmark on Smart Energy
  - c. Germany: Bavaria, Sachsen-Anhalt, Thuringen
  - **d. France**: Normandie, Centre-Val-de Loire, Paris IIe de France, Grand Est, Occitanie, La Réunion. Coverage of the outermost regions of France should be taken into account, if relevant
  - e. Hungary: Artificial Intelligence; High Performance Computing with a maximum EU funding of 875 000€
  - f. Romania: Sud-Vest Oltenia
- 3) Designated potential EDIH aiming at getting the "seal of excellence". These proposals will <u>not receive any</u> <u>funding of Digital Europe Programme</u>, but their countries have the intention to support them with national funding. With the Seal of Excellence they will have the possibility to become full members of the EDIH network. EDIHs which have already received a Seal of Excellence after the first call do not need to reapply. This possibility is open for:

  Bulgaria, Italy, Portugal, Poland, Spain and Sweden.

### Timeline is very compressed

Most of the proposals are resubmissions from the first call All the proposals are pre-selected and supported by their Country



### Timeline – the entire programme 2021 2022 Call 1 EDIH (36-month contract) 2023 Call 2 EDIH (36-month contract) 2024 Call 3 EDIH (36-month contract), t.b.d. NEW WORKPROGRAMME (financial commitment not yet available) 2025 Call 2023 EDIH (48-month contract) 2026 Under the future workprogramme, a 2027 new call will be setup. All existing EDIH will be invited to submit a new proposal for another 4-year grant. 2028 Detailed information will be available after the financial commitment
